Entries: Exhibit must be clean, fresh and conform to specifications. All samples must be from this year's crop "2018". Containers for exhibits will be provided by the department.

Margaret Sherald Beals Perpetual Trophy

Award will be presented to the exhibit judged "Best-In-Show" Adult in the Farm & Garden Department. Award cannot be won more than three consecutive years by the same person. Trophy will be limited to Anne Arundel County exhibitors only. Winner is requested to be present on Sunday at 4 p.m. to accept the award.

Frances A. Overstreet Perpetual Award

A \$25.00 cash award is awarded for the "Best-In-Show" Teen in the Farm & Garden Department. Award cannot be won more than three consecutive years by the same person. Trophy will be limited to Anne Arundel County exhibitors only. Winner is requested to be present on Sunday at 4 p.m. to accept the award.

John J. Sutton Perpetual Award

A \$50.00 cash award is awarded for the "Best-In-Show" Youth in the Farm & Garden Department. Award cannot be won more than three consecutive years by the same person. Trophy will be limited to Anne Arundel County exhibitors only. Winner is requested to be present on Sunday at 4 p.m. to accept the award.

FK1 TOBACCO: Open to **ADULTS ONLY** growers in all five Maryland counties, southern district. Exhibit must contain a sample of three bundles of twelve leaves each, not including the wrapper leaf, which must be of the same quality as the others. Leaves must not be ironed but spread flat one upon another. Each exhibitor shall enter only one sample of three bundles from his/her farm or crop. In case a crop is jointly owned by two or more persons or landlord and tenant, only one sample of three bundles shall be entered from that crop or farm. Samples will be judged (according to U.S. Grade) on their uniformity as well as quality, length, color, and condition. All samples must be from this year's crop (2017-18). Samples on which a premium is paid cannot be re-entered.

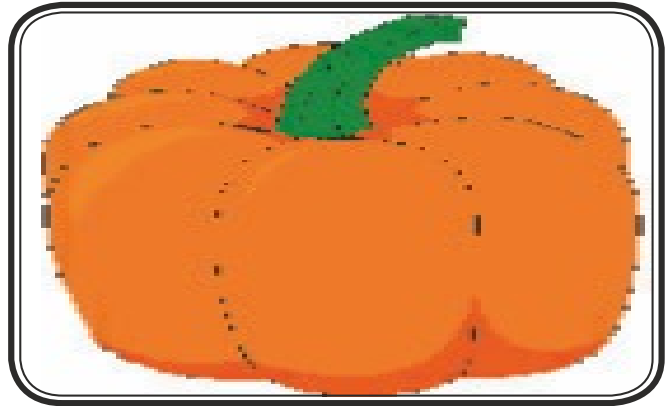
