- 1). ALL exhibitors are responsible for the completion of their exhibit form and entry tags. Use of address labels is encouraged, but should fit within the space allowed. We will assist you if you have difficulties.
- 2). If exhibit is entered in the "Other" category, please list name of plant material(s). If a category is listed in the catalogue, the entry may not be entered in the "other" category
- 3). Exhibitors must provide their own containers of clear, non-tinted glass containers, appropriately sized to specimen.
CLEAR GLASS BEADS MAY BE USED TO STABILIZE LARGE OR TOP HEAVY ENTRIES.
- 4). Exhibitors must provide saucers for potted and hanging plants, or they cannot be watered.
- 5). See section for size limitations of foliage for potted plants.
- 6). Entries must have been grown by exhibitor and/or been in his/her possession for at least three months (except in Arrangement)
- 7). Classes may be divided by color or variety if warranted by the number of entries.
- 8). All flowers are to have some foliage. Foliage should not be below the water line of the container used.
- 9). If more then one flower is required, they should be of the same color and size.
- 10). Flowering plants should be in flower.
- 11). Potted or hanging plants with mixed foliage MUST have a 3" x 5" card attached, with the identification of all the plant material.
- 12.) Youth and Teen may enter any category.



Folger M. Ridout Perpetual Trophy

The Folger M. Ridout Perpetual Trophy is awarded to the exhibit judged "Best In Show Adult" by the judges in the flower department. The Best In Show can not be won more 3 consecutive years by the same person. The Trophy will be limited to Anne Arundel County Exhibitors.
