## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fair Members,

So far, we have missed any significant "Winter Weather." The crocus and daffodils are trying to bloom and the purple buds are not far behind. Many of the areas strawberry and apple farmers are a bit concerned with the greatly fluctuating weather. Hopefully, the weather will stabilize a bit and we can enjoy the fruits of their labor this late spring and fall.

We have many Fairground projects that need to be completed before Fair Week, and some need to be completed before rentals begin in earnest. I can supply a list if you would like to consider taking on a project. We can use your help.

As has been discussed, the county has "Special Event Permit" legislation before the County Council. This will require larger events to apply for a "special events" permit. It has some language that is favorable to our large Fair events (Fair Week and Rodeo). It will certainly be in any events' best interest to get their application in as early as possible. The legislation is similar to what is in place in most other urban counties and Annapolis City. We are working with the county to make sure the legislature is as helpful to the Fair as it is to the county agencies.

After many, many months of discussion, it was decided that the horse ring announcer stand was in need of major repairs and costs of the repairs and moving the structure was too great. Considering its condition and subsequent safety issues, the stand was torn down and removed. It was a tough decision but the right decision. We look to replace the stand with much smaller stands at some point in the near future.

Rentals are going strong with most weekends booked. If you would like to chaperone a rental, please reach out and we will give you all the information needed.

This year will be our first "Bunny in the Barnyard" event, hosted by our Gina Degreenia.
